WAYS TO VOTE

There are many ways you can vote this election! Here's how you can make your voice heard:



- You can vote early at your designated polling location!
- Advance voting days are on February 20th, 21st, and 22nd from 10 AM to 8 PM EST.
- Bring an ID showing your name and address.
- Scan the QR code on the right and find your voting location.

VOTE ON ELECTION DAY

- Election Day is on February 27th, from 9 AM 9 PM EST.
- Vote at your designated polling location. Scan the QR code above to find your location.
- You don't need to be on the voters list to vote! Just bring an ID that shows your name and address. See the other side for more details.

VOTE BY MAIL

- Apply online before February 21st at 6 PM EST to get your voting kit: <u>votebymail.elections.on.ca/</u>
- If you're submitting a paper application, send the form and a copy of your ID to sb@elections.on.ca or mail it to Elections Ontario, Special Ballot, 26 Prince Andrew Place, Toronto, Ontario M3C 2H4.

VOTE WITHOUT A PERMANENT ADDRESS

- You can vote without a permanent address! The place where you've eaten or slept most in the past five weeks counts as your address.
- Ask the Executive Director of the shelter, drop-in, food bank, or community health centre for a Certificate of Identity and Residence form. Both of you must sign it.
- They or a staff member must also help you find where you can vote.
- Take the signed certificate to your assigned voting location.
- Give it to the election official and they will give you a ballot to vote.

WHO CAN VOTE

- You're at least 18 years old
- You're a Canadian citizen
- You live in Ontario

IF YOU'RE REGISTERED

Bring any government-issued ID with your name and address, like:

- An Ontario Health Card
- An Ontario Photo Card
- Credit or Debit Card

IF YOU'RE NOT REGISTERED

No worries! You can still vote by registering at your polling station. Just bring one of these:

- A document showing your name and address (like a utility bill or lease agreement)
- A piece of ID and proof of your address
